Dear Parents,

This week the focus is Secondary Science, where Mr. Sam Shadbolt, who is also our Secondary Coordinator, has brought a strongly practical approach to this year's teaching, providing the students with authentic experiences.

As we continue to navigate the pandemic, I want to thank all members of the BCA Community: students, staff and parents, for their understanding and support, and large amounts of goodwill and downright hard work in ensuring the learning continues and the education remains at the highest quality possible.

Lunch Service

I recently communicated to you some developments in our catering service, and the positive developments to constructive feedback from parents. An additional change is that from February there will be a change in the nutritionist who supports Irina Ponsico and her team: Berta Jiménez is the President of the Andorran College of Dieticians and Nutritionists, and already works with several other schools.

We will now take time to further improve our food offer, and will take another round of feedback on this topic shortly before the end of the school year.

Request to all parents to complete a SEPA Mandate

Dear BCA Parents,

Last March Andorran banks, in agreement with the Government, joined the SEPA (Single Euro Payments Area).

This integration formally affects the school when making direct debits as a result of school fees and other bills.

Before, we have had tacit consent to send bills to the account you have provided us with, however, in order to comply with the regulations that impose SEPA integration, we need the signature of a consent given by the debtor to the creditor, formalised through a document called "SEPA Mandate".

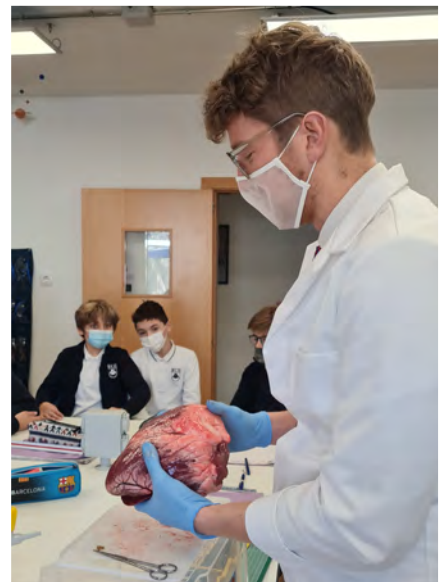

Science Dissection

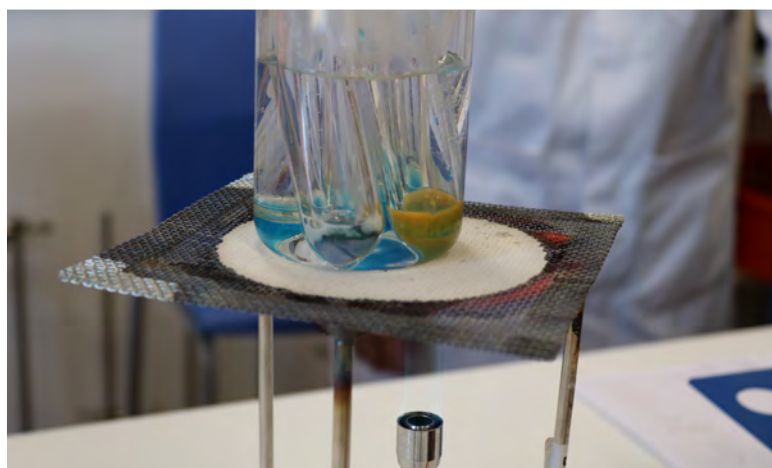




Experiment Y10

In IGCSE Science, students have started a new topic called Nutrition and Digestion. The first part of the topic involves testing to see which components (starch, sugar, protein and fats) are in different types of food.

Although these are relatively simple tests, this kind of science is the basis of forensics, drug testing in sports, and testing for diseases. Students developed their practical and observational skills in this experiment.
