



LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL



We have had an enormously positive start to the term. The focus remains relentlessly on our core purpose: providing the best possible education for the children, in the classroom and beyond. Beautiful displays that have gone up around the school in the last week give a hint about the excitement in the classroom: 'The Solar System'; 'Medieval Castles'; 'Fantasy Literature' and many more.

We kicked off the term with the BCA Spring Fair, the most ambitious event of its kind so far. Blessed with dry, sunny weather and temperatures in the high 20's, our community came together and raised a grand total of €3481, the proceeds going to partner charities Patronat Dames Nostra Sra de Meritxell and UNICEE

Andorra. It was particularly pleasing to see the generosity of parent helpers and sponsors in supporting the event, the leadership of the secondary school student leaders, and the creativity and endless energy of the BCA staff in running events (even 'Sponge the Teacher', a British school fair classic, was a pleasure!).

In this newsletter please read the poem, 'BCA Community in Bloom', composed of a series of haiku, a traditional Japanese form, written by students, teachers, and parents during the Spring Fair. Swimming, as always, is on the calendar this term for all Early Years and Primary students, developing benefits of health, fitness, and confidence on many levels.

The last of our parent-teacher-student conferences has taken place, with the rich conversations around learning setting the agenda for the remainder of this school year, and the beginning of next. Last year we introduced student-led conferences in Early Years and Primary, and this was the second year we ran them. In the language of business innovation, we view ourselves as 'early adopters' in this area. Increasingly, other schools internationally are following this approach. The End of Year reports will be issued for all students in the last week of June.

Our new Special Educational Needs Coordinator, Ms. Judith Sansa, is working closely with the students, staff, and parents to ensure that all children, with support where needed, can access the curriculum, and is already adding value to the BCA experience and to student success.

Our Year 11 students are about to commence an intensive month of examinations for the award of the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), an externally awarded, internationally recognised qualification. It is the culmination of the two year courses they have followed and to some extent of the whole of their secondary education. We wish them all the best and the success that they deserve-the results are published in August. Next year our (by then) Year 13 students will be taking their final exams for the IB Diploma.

This is also the season for school trips, near and far. We now have a complete and planned progression in place, from day trips up until Year 2, then the first overnight trips in Years 3 and 4, through to a two week expedition to Peru in Year 12. All children benefit enormously from residential trips such as these, and I thank the staff for stepping forward with the vision and commitment to propose and lead them.

Finally, the BCA team was proud and happy to support last week's celebration of 30 years of UK-Andorra Diplomatic relations, hosted by The British Ambassador His Excellency Mr. Hugh Elliott and Mrs. María Antonia Martín Elliott, in the presence of Sr. Xavier Espot Zamora, Prime Minister of Andorra, and attended by over a hundred guests from Andorra, the UK and beyond. It was great to hear that many knew of The British College and its reputation for academic excellence and a progressive, student-centered approach. And they even provided *'fish and chips'*, guaranteed to keep any Anglophile happy!

REMINDERS/ NOTICES

Fees for external examinations and tests

A reminder that, as set out in the fee schedule, the cost of purchasing external examinations and tests are charged to parents. This includes entry fees for IGCSE and IB examinations, as well as standardised tests used across Primary and Secondary, such as for cognitive aptitudes ('CAT4') and reading proficiency (NGRT). In each case, parents are provided with the results or report from the test. The cost of examinations such as IGCSE and IB can be substantial, although only incurred in Years 10, 11 and 12. The schedule of charges, which are all exactly 'at cost' from the examination board or other provider, are published on the Parent Portal, and updated annually.
